

Authors are **strongly encouraged** to submit papers based on their presentations or related efforts to the seven (7) special journal issues associated with this meeting.

PUBLICATIONS POLICY

Submit tentative titles and authors with corresponding author's full contact information via email by Monday, April 12, 2010 to Paul Solomon, (Solomon.paul@epa.gov). This will allow the tracking of papers since you will be submitting papers directly to journals as well as notify you of any extensions to the due date.

Papers must be submitted to journals no later than April 30, 2010.

Submissions must adhere to the publication guidelines specified by each individual journal. We suggest you visit the website(s) of the journal(s) you wish to submit papers to and review those guidelines. All journals require electronic submission. Please note in all cases that your paper is being submitted to the 2010 AAAR Air Pollution and Health Conference Special Issue. There may be a separate link to note this or it might need to be noted in the editors comment box. Late papers will be included in the special issue if they are able to catch up with those submitted on time.

In all cases, submit an electronic copy by email to Paul Solomon in addition to normal journal submission. Electronic copies to Paul Solomon can be sent in standard word processing formats (Word or Word Perfect) or **PDF** (preferred). Do NOT zip the files as the attachments will be stripped from the email by the EPA firewall.

Include, in the body of your email to Paul Solomon, the journal you are submitting the paper to, the date submitted, full contact information for the author to which correspondence should be made as well as the first author.

Seven journals have agreed to consider special issues consisting of high quality scientific original papers. They are:

Atmospheric Environment (AE).

Environmental Health Perspectives (EHP).

Inhalation Toxicology

Journal of Exposure Science and Environmental Epidemiology

DISCLAIMER

Special Issues in many journals are costly to the organizing group, in this case AAAR. If insufficient conference funds are available for one or more special issues the submitted papers will simply move into the journals normal submission and review process and be published if accepted as individual papers.
